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

THE FIRE

Why am I crying? I thought to myself as I stared into the bonfire flames that reached high into the sky. The entire student body had gathered that autumn night on the soccer field. Under the leadership of the senior class, we were invited to come and pray over the new school year—dedicating it and ourselves to whatever God wanted done in our school and in our lives. Giant tears rolled down my cheeks as I stood there hand in hand with other members of my junior class, praying, praising, and worshipping. An unexpected change was taking place in me; that fire we encircled was nothing compared to the one that was growing in my heart at that moment. The Holy Spirit was using those giant bonfire flames to remind me of a time when a fire for the things of God burned bright in my heart as a young boy, when all I dreamed of was being a preacher of the gospel. Standing there that night, I realized two things. One, I had allowed my fire to fade away to not much more than a flicker. And two, I wanted it to roar again like it had once before.



In 2 Timothy 1:6, Paul wrote to this young pastor and said, "I remind you to stir up the gift of God which is in you." Paul used a peculiar word when he told Timothy to "stir up" the gift. It was the Greek word *anazopyreo*, and it is the only time this word appears in the New Testament. I'm no Greek scholar, but from what I have learned, this word is best understood when you take it apart into the three words it is comprised of.

First, you see the word *ana* that I understand is simply a preposition meaning "up" or "again." Secondly, you see the word *zo* that is the root word in *zoe* meaning "life." Lastly you see the word *pyreo* that means "fire." So when Paul told Timothy to "stir up the gift of God," he was telling him to put *life* in the *fire* again. An understanding of the word *anazopyreo* is the reason the New Living Translation of 2 Timothy 1:6 says, "I remind you to fan into flames the spiritual gift God gave you."

It will also help you to understand what Paul meant when he talked to Timothy about the "gift" that was in him. The word gift in English is the Greek word charisma. Think about someone you know who has a lot of charisma. Are they outgoing, outspoken, vibrant, and full of life? Do they lead themselves and others well? Are they especially talented in a given area? It's no wonder we describe people with a lot of charisma as those who are extremely gifted. But look closely again at the word charisma. Do you see the root word *charis? Charis* is the Greek word for grace. Think again about that charismatic person you know, but this time I want you to realize what you see in their life is more than just an overflow of talent, skill, and leadership

ability. What you're witnessing is an overflow of the grace of God on them.

Did you notice I instructed you to think of someone else you know who is gifted, talented, and charismatic? I did that because most people find it difficult to think of themselves in that way. But you need to know that you also have been gifted by God, and within you right at this moment is a flickering flame waiting for you to douse it with the fuel it needs to burn bright. It's time for you to stir up the gift and put life in the fire again.

"I REMIND YOU TO FAN INTO FLAMES THE SPIRITUAL GIFT GOD GAVE YOU." 2 TIMOTHY 1:6

I want to give you some practical help in finding ways to rekindle the flame that may have once burned bright in you for the things of God and for His call on your life. But before we get there, we need to find out what causes the fire to die down or go out completely.

The call of God and grace on Timothy's life to pastor was obvious to Paul and to many others I'm sure. But the one person who struggled to recognize the gift was Timothy himself. The verse we looked at in 2 Timothy was in fact not the first time Paul had to give him a talking-to about his gift. In his first letter to Timothy, Paul told him to "stop neglecting the gift" that was in him (1 Timothy 4:14). It may have been difficult to convey a stern tone with parchment and ink, but I have no doubt Timothy got the message loud and clear. He had been distracted by the pressure and persecution he was under, not only from the world outside the church but also from elders and leaders within his own church body. Paul was letting him know in no uncertain terms that all the while he was so consumed with the opinions of other people, he was neglecting the grace of God on his life—the very grace he would need to sustain him through the pressure.

Likewise, when we're consumed with the dissenting opinions of other people; we also neglect, ignore, and subsequently starve the gift God put within us. Every living thing must be fed in order for it to stay alive. Have you ever had a household plant that

you neglected to feed over time?
What happened to it? It died.
That's what happens to things that don't get fed. They die. And that's what has happened to the fire of God in so many people who once were passionate in their pursuit of Him and His plan for their lives.

They got distracted by the opposition they encountered from people or from extenuating circumstances, and over time, they began neglecting to feed the fire inside them.

The word neglect can also mean "to give no regard to." We often neglect the gift and grace God has given us when we compare it to the one we see in someone else. I know that as a young minister, I have had to guard against this temptation in my own life. It would be so easy for me to look at any one of the many ministers and ministries in the world that are having a global impact and decide that my gift isn't as good or as big as the one I see in them. Or I could be guilty of studying them and their ministry methods so intently that I become more familiar with the call of God on their lives than I am with the one on my own. Either way, I'd be guilty

of neglecting the gift He's given me by giving it little or no regard and valuing it as a lesser gift than the one He gave somebody else. We've all been guilty of these things at one time or another, so allow me to say to you what Paul said to Timothy (and what I've heard the Holy Spirit say to me a time or two or ten): STOP IT!

Just like Timothy, we have to be reminded to stir up the gift in us and to fuel the flames that used to rise high. So how do we go about stirring ourselves up? It's simple really. You do it the same way you do everything else in your walk with God—by faith.

On our first day of shooting for Legacy Television, Sarah and I and our whole team were so excited to finally be doing the thing we knew God wanted us to do. The lights were shining, the cameras were rolling, and everybody was in their right places. But at the end of the day, I forewarned our team that we were beginning something that had no end, and that there could come a time when the sheer repetitiveness of making television broadcasts would try to drain us of our passion and excitement for fulfilling the plan of God. When the natural excitement wanes and wears off, that's when you have to get your words of faith cranked up: "I love shooting TV broadcasts! I love writing articles! I love traveling here and there and everywhere to preach the Gospel!"

What am I doing when I say these things out loud? I'm stirring up the gift of God that's in me. You have to do the same thing. When it feels like the fire has all but gone out, and the warmth you used to feel from its flames has turned to a dull smolder, give voice to what you believe instead of what you see. Say out loud, "I love God, and I love His Word. His plan for me is good and His grace in me is great. My gift burns bright and will draw others to Jesus in a big way."

Another practical tip for stirring up the gift in you is to simply be thankful for it. When you compare your gift to someone else's or wish you had theirs instead, you are, in essence, telling God that He made a mistake with you, and that you'd like to trade your grace in for the one some other guy got. But that is not being thankful for what you've been given. When you're tempted to neglect your gift because of a preoccupation with someone else's, that is when you need to get extra thankful for what God has put in you. Giving thanks will stoke the embers of a dying fire and cause it to flame up again.

Finally, one of the greatest ways to anazopyreo the gift of God in your life is to just **find a way to use it**. Here's what you need to know about the grace of God that is on your life: it was given to you so that you may serve someone else with it. In fact, if you came to me

and told me that you feel like your fire has died down, the first thing I'd ask you is, "Are you serving somewhere?" Nothing kindles the flames like serving a big vision, even if the vision is not necessarily your own. In other words, don't just attend church; be the church. Find a way to serve the local body that God has connected you to. In doing so, you'll either discover the gifting and graces He's put on your life, or you will stir up the ones that burned bright long ago.

That night I stood gazing at that bonfire changed some things for me. It rekindled in me a desire to be used by God for His kingdom and to His glory. Over the next couple of years, I fed those flames in two main ways. First, I got around people whose fire was bigger than mine, and I let their passion fuel my own. Second, I threw myself into serving in our church. I can honestly say that night set my life on a course that has brought me to where I am right now. So the next time you're cuddled up in front of the fireplace or sitting around the campfire, I encourage you to look at those flames and let the Holy Spirit talk to you about the blaze He wants to light inside. **Stoke** the embers! Rake the coals! Fan the flames! It's time to put life in the fire again.

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G E T - YOUR OWN G O D

It was 1986, and I was only three-years old. I don't remember a lot about that year other than my mom's giant rockstar hair, her sweet smile, and my very first moment with Jesus. I loved to sit in my room inside my little, plastic playhouse and watch *The Gospel Bill Show*. If you're not familiar with this television program, let me introduce you to my childhood. When my brothers came along, we didn't want to watch anything else. God used a man dressed up as a cowboy to preach the Gospel to millions of children all over the world, and I was one of them. I don't remember everything he said, but I'll never forget the moment the presence of the Lord filled up my room. The Holy Spirit reached down into my heart and lit a fire, and then I reached out by faith and took Him as **MY OWN**.

Throughout the Psalms, David claims God as his own. He not only refers to Him as God, he calls Him specifically "my God." We get an up-close look into his personal relationship in Psalm 63:1-2. David has been running from King Saul, hiding in the cliffs of En Gedi, and missing the courts of the Lord. He cries out, "O God, you are **my God**; early will I seek You; my soul thirsts for You; my flesh longs for you....So I have looked for You in the sanctuary, to see Your power and Your glory."

David had a real relationship with God. They had a history together. He had seen His faithfulness time and time again, his memory full of victories where God had helped him slay the lion and the bear. It was God who came alongside him, and together they defeated Goliath. It was God who promoted him and made him king over Israel. God became reality to him, and over time, David developed a genuine faith of his own.

Throughout Scripture, we see real people who had real relationships with God

that produced real results. Results don't come without relationship. This faith life that we are living is not just a set of rules and regulations, or steps and methods to get what we want. It is an opportunity to have a living

communion with our awesome God.

A good relationship is the result of a lot of good conversations. We were meant to have words between us. It takes two people to have a really good conversation. If one person is talking the whole time and the other can't get a word in to respond, there will be no growth, nothing special to build upon, and no real relationship between them.

But God is after real relationships with us. He longs for continual conversation.

He no longer wants to be endured but enjoyed. He longs to love and to be loved. When He sent us Jesus, He threw His grace at us. And now He only desires one thing from us—faith. "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him" (Hebrews 11:6).

He's after a dialogue, not a monologue, where He speaks and we respond. A good conversation can't be one-sided; it takes two to make a thing go right! My husband calls it living in the conversation between grace and faith.

Grace is God's part; faith is ours. Faith is simply our response to God's grace. Grace says, "You are healed," and in response I say, "Thank you. I receive." What a healthy relationship—grace and faith working together!

Throughout the gospels, we see Jesus engaging in His part of the conversation through teaching, preaching, and healing. We know that He is still healing today because Hebrews 13:8 tells us, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever."

"GOD, YOU ARE MY GOD; EARLY WILL I SEEK YOU. MY SOUL THIRSTS FOR YOU; MY FLESH LONGS FOR YOU.... SO I HAVE LOOKED FOR YOU IN THE SANCTUARY, TO SEE YOUR POWER AND YOUR GLORY."

PSALM 63:1-2

Healing is not only something He gives, healing is who He is. Healing is at His core. It is His very nature. In the Old Testament, the very name for God our healer is Jehovah Rapha, the one who mends us back together and restores us to normal. So when you and I spend time in His presence, healing always comes. His presence is medicine, and healing happens when we are with the Healer.

If healing always comes, why do some still not receive? Is it God's fault? Is it all up to Him?

People miss their miracle through miscommunication. Have you ever been in a conversation and, for some reason, you misunderstood what someone else was trying to say to you? Have you ever been so frustrated that you had no idea how to respond, so you just shut your mouth, turned, and walked away? I know I've done that. People everywhere are not fully grasping the goodness of God, the grace of God, and the finished work of Jesus. Many do not understand the love He's trying to communicate to them and just how powerful their response is. If you and I will refuse to get frustrated,

and instead respond to Him with words of faith, we will see our miracle!

In the gospels, person after person who came to Jesus with a need had to engage in their part of the conversations if they wanted their miracles. They had to have their own faith. We know this because Jesus didn't take full responsibility for healing; He gave God glory and put an emphasis on the individual's faith. He said to so many, "Your faith has made you whole" and "according to your faith be it unto you."

In Mark 5, there's a conversation between Jesus and a woman who has been bleeding for twelve years. She has suffered for so long, and she just keeps getting worse. She is a mess from the inside

out. She is discouraged because doctors can not help her, and she is totally broke from trying to get better. But when she hears about Jesus, she believes that He can heal her. We hear her faith in her words, "If only I may touch His clothes, I shall be made well."

We also see her faith through her actions; she does everything she can to get to Jesus and to respond to His loving conversation, and then it happens: "Immediately the fountain of her blood was dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of the affliction" (Mark 5:29). Things are getting personal now, aren't they? A relationship is beginning; a conversation is starting. She knows that if she wants a miracle, she has to get real with God. This thing is between Jesus and her alone. No one else. She has to have faith of her own. She's having to get her own God.

I love how the Amplified Bible portrays His response to her: "Daughter, your faith [your personal trust and confidence in Me] has restored you to health; go in peace and be [permanently] healed from your suffering" (Mark 5:34).

Two words always stand out to me when I read these stories about Jesus healing others: YOUR FAITH. But when I read it today, only one word leaped off the page: **YOUR**.

Faith becomes real when it becomes yours. Paul saw this kind of real faith in Timothy and encouraged him when he said, "I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded is in you also" (2 Timothy 1:5).

When my mother was pregnant with me, she started bleeding. The doctors told her she was going to miscarry, but she stood on the Word, trusted God, and He came through for us, so I'm alive today. When I was four, I had scarlet fever and lost a lot of my eyesight and had to wear glasses. My mom, dad, grandma, and grandpa all came together and agreed in faith that I would be healed, and I was. I have perfect 20/20 vision today. When I was little, I was healed by the grace of God and my parents' and grandparents' faith. But there would come a time when I would have to get my own God.

Fast forward thirty years to when I was pregnant with my second baby. I began to bleed just like my mom did with me. As I lay in bed that night, fear tried to surround me. I began to pray and seek the Lord. It was time for an honest conversation with Him. I needed the wisdom that only comes through fellowship. I knew that the Bible said if I submitted myself to God, I could resist the devil, and He would flee from me. So I did that. I did everything I knew to do.

I asked Jeremy to pray in the Spirit with me, and I searched my heart for anything that would hinder me from keeping this baby. It was time to get real with God. I didn't want anything between me and Him because I knew that He was my answer, and if my heart were completely clear, my faith would freely flow to my Father.

All of the sudden, a couple flashed before my eyes. I had forgiven them by faith, but I didn't realize there was something in me that was still holding on to that hurt. I turned to Jeremy and said that we had to call them and apologize! The truth is I don't even know what we were apologizing for, but I always remember Brother Hagin saying, "LOVE IS THE WAY TO VICTORY." I was willing to do whatever it took to get unforgiveness out of the way so that faith could fill my heart. My baby was worth it, so even though it was the middle of the night, we called those people and made it right. My heart was clear. I was free to believe. I could stand strong and respond fully in faith.

1 John 3:21 says, "Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence toward God."

By morning I had stopped bleeding, and when we arrived at the doctor's office, the ultrasound showed a perfectly healthy baby in my womb. I am so thankful that I had a God of my own who was there for me in a time of trouble. I'm so glad I had a personal relationship with Him where He could speak to me by His spirit and show me what to do. I'm so glad I had the opportunity to respond in faith

to His grace and to His leading, and I could stand for my baby's healing. I am so glad I have my Jessie Grace today.

All those years ago when I received Jesus as the Lord of my life, I started a conversation with God, and since that time we've developed a history together. Over the years and throughout many situations, we have had many more conversations. Because of the Word that I have heard and the miracles I have seen, my faith in Him has grown. I have watched Him be faithful to His Word and faithful to me. I have stood on His Word, and He has come through for me every time. Now I believe because He said it, but I trust because I know Him.





A Letter from Pastors Jordan and Melissa Gash

In November of 2004, my wife, Melissa, and I planted Oswego Family Church in Oswego, Illinois. We first became partners with Pearsons Ministries International as a church body several years later in the fall of 2011. We could see God's grace upon Jeremy and Sarah, and we wanted to be a part of helping them preach Jesus and the message of faith to this generation. Looking back, we can see now that the Lord was connecting us, not only to new friends and to a special ministry but also to a bigger vision. Since that time, our church has prospered, grown larger, and is about to take the biggest step we have ever taken since we started nearly thirteen years ago.

In October of 2015, Melissa and I attended PMI's Legacy Leadership Summit at Legacy Studios. Brother Kenneth Copeland ministered powerfully on faith in one of the evening sessions, and afterwards Jeremy and Sarah encouraged all of us who had just been in that atmosphere of faith to go before the Lord and ask Him for whatever we needed for our churches and ministries. That night Melissa and I joined hands and asked the Lord for everything that we needed in order to do what He has called us to do, and we specifically asked for the right buildings and land for our ministry. Then, just a couple months later, in January of 2016, the Lord began dealing with us in a time of prayer about land in a specific area not far from our present location. We realize now that He was preparing our hearts to see the provision that He already had in store for us.

In March of this year, we received a phone call about an opportunity to purchase 34 acres of land with a building on site, one that is larger than our current facility. The land and building last sold in 2006 for 5.1 million dollars, but the seller ultimately agreed to accept our offer of \$442,000! Not only is this an amazing price, but also this property is in the exact location that we were praying about the year before. We are in awe of God's goodness, and we are confident that He has been answering the prayer that we prayed that night at Legacy Summit in the

fall of 2015. This land is exceeding and abundantly above all that we could have asked for. The building on site, once renovated, gives us an immediate opportunity to grow, and the land gives us unlimited possibilities for future growth and expansion. Our church is on an exciting journey of faith; and as partners, Jeremy, Sarah, and PMI have been with us on this journey.

In August of 2017, we launched the "Beyond Boundaries Project" to begin the funding of both the land purchase and renovation of the vacant building on site. The same week that we started the project, Jeremy and Sarah contacted us to let us know that PMI was going to be sending the first gift towards the project costs! This gift was more encouraging to us than they know, and we just want to say with all of our hearts, thank you, PMI partners, for helping us reach the people living in our community with the message of grace, faith, and victory. We are in this together!

There really is power in partnership. It's true that God has a unique plan and purpose for each of our lives, but we have discovered personally that a big part of that plan coming to pass is being connected to the people that the Lord joins us to. The truth is that we need each other, and we are stronger together. If you are not already a partner with PMI, I would encourage you to pray about becoming a partner. This ministry is special, and it is life giving. Not only are we blessed and strengthened by the ministry that we receive, but as partners, we're a part of sending the ministry of Jesus around the world, and together, we're leaving a legacy of faith to our generation.

Thank you for standing in agreement with us on the seed we sowed into PMI.


Partnership with our household-of-faith family is a beautiful thing.

He stayed in the hospital for two-and-a-half months, but there was nothing missing and nothing broken. He was complete and he was healthy. He turns two this month.
